

Is my child a self-directed learner?

What makes The Village School unique is our emphasis on self-directed learning. In creating a community of self-directed learners, these are some of the things we "look-for" before inviting young learners to join our community. These are strong indicators that our learning environment may be a good fit for your child.

Spark Studio:

- 1. Exhibits a positive attitude about learning in general
- 2. Participates willingly in classroom activities
- 3. Follows oral instructions.
- 4. Actively engages in their own learning and is generally curious
- 5. Is physically self-reliant

Discovery (Elementary) Studio: (Below are additional fit indicators for the ES)

- 1. Reading fluently.
- 2. Follow basic written and oral instructions.
- 3. Able to engage and participate in a 15-minute discussion with peers.
- 4. Can set, remember, and pursue a goal for 30 minutes or more.
- 5. Works well with peers by respecting their space and goals.
- 6. Takes responsibility for actions and choices.
- 7. Can operate a laptop.

Adventure (Middle) and High School Studios:

- 1. Positive attitude about learning in general
- 2. Takes responsibility for learning and problem-solving on their own
- 3. Self-advocates
- 4. Follows complex written and oral directions
- 5. Willingness to help others and demonstrates leadership
- 6. Can set, remember, and pursue a goal for 45+ minutes

- 7. Takes care of studio and personal space with organization skills
- 8. Is prepared for a more academically-challenging environment
- 9. Has a strong "why" for wanting a learner-driven education
